The tax rate for Milton was set by the State Dept of Revenue Administration on November 24, 2021. The rate is \$22.86 per thousand of Property evaluation. The rate for 2020 was \$22.16.

The Selectman moved \$750,000 of the un-assigned fund balance to offset potential increases in the tax rate when working with the State to se the tax rate.

It is expected that the tax bills for the second half of 2021 wll go out in the mail this week. The expected due date will be Monday, January 3, 2022.



The town has enacted a winter parking ban effective December 1, 2021 - April 15, 2022 10:30 pm - 7:00 am and during declared snow emergencies. The ban prohibits parking in or on all public ways and town streets. Each violation will be subject to a \$25.00 fine and towing fees. The purpose of the winter parking ban is to allow winter maintenance crews, unobstructed snow removal or ice control measures in the event of extreme weather

<u>A Local Timber Harvest</u> <u>Workshop</u> on Saturday, December 4, 2021 9:00 - 11:00 AM Rain or Shine hosted by Jonathan Nute

Local Timber Harvest Workshop on <u>December 4</u> The Milton Conservation Commission (MCC) will offer a free Timber Harvest Workshop on Saturday, December 4, from 9 to 11 am at a local tree farm on Hare Road in Milton. Retired forester Jonathan Nute will give an educational tour of a 2-acre harvest area, part of his 11-acre woodlot that is protected by conservation easement.

Before retiring to family land in Milton, Nute served for 29 years as Forest Resources Extension Educator for UNH Cooperative Extension in Hillsborough County and has received awards for his work as a forester and educator. He currently serves on the Board of Moose Mountains Regional Greenways and the Milton Planning Board. Participants of his previous guided walks at nearby Casey Road Conservation Land have been enthusiastic about how much knowledge they gained about the ecological history of that land. The upcoming workshop will be an opportunity for Milton residents and friends to learn about managing a woodlot, including harvesting decisions and practices, logging equipment, and maple sugaring. Preregistration is helpful but not required. The MCC may be contacted at mcc@miltonnh-us.com. The workshop will be held rain or shine; in the case of inclement weather, the gathering will take place in the hay barn. Cars may be parked in the field

across from the white mailbox #45 on Hare Road. The mission of the Milton Conservation Commission is to provide for the proper utilization and protection of the natural resources and watershed resources in the Town of Milton, in accordance with NH RSA 36-A. Firewood Permits

Permits for dead and down wood are issued for personal use for as few as two cords or as many as five cords per calendar year. The cost is \$20 for 2 cords and \$10 for each additional cord up to 5 maximum.

The personal use firewood permit covers most of the White Mountain National Forest, excluding active timber sales, developed recreation areas, designated Wilderness, and the Bartlett and Hubbard Brook Experimental Forests.

Need to know before purchasing a firewood permit:

- A permit can be purchased with cash or check made out to the 'US Forest Service'.
- At the time of purchase please provide a valid drivers license and vehicle registration for the vehicle that will be used to collect the firewood.
- ▶ The permit expires December 31 in the calendar year it was issued.

Christmas tree permits

Create special memories by bringing your family to the White Mountain National Forest to cut your own Christmas tree.

Helpful information about Christmas Tree permits:

- Tree permits can be purchased for \$5.00. Permits can be purchased online or through our district offices.
- ▶ Trees are for personal use only, not for resale. One tree per family
- Use only hand tools to cut Christmas trees, such as an ax or handsaw. Chainsaws are not permitted.
- Make sure you are on National Forest land. Respect the rights of landowners when crossing private property.
- Do not cut trees within 100 feet of:
 - campgrounds
 - picnic areas
 - trailheads or developed recreation areas
 - experimental forests
 - designated wilderness areas
- water bodies
- active timber sales.
- Do not cut trees within 100 feet of paved roads and 50 feet from dirt roads.
- Do not cut trees larger than 6 inches in diameter at chest height. Pack down limb piles low enough so they are within 2 feet of the ground.
- ▶ Cut your tree so remaining stumps will be less than 10 inches in height.
