





Workshop Wednesdays On The Farm

July 14th: Explore The Night Sky

7:00 – 10:00 pm (\$15 /\$10 for members)

Come explore the night sky and observe the constellations. A short film will be shown to aid in constellation identification. Then, bring your own folding chair or blanket as we go into the field in search of Orion, the North Star, the Big Dipper, the Little Dipper and more! Instructor: Dave Maleham

July 21st: A Walk Through The Woods

10:00 am – 12 Noon (\$15 / \$10 for members)

Learn the basics of tree and forest life. Go for a walk through the forest and see what resources are available to sustain farm life. As the farmer walked along, he would be looking for what his woods provided – firewood for heat and cooking; lumber for buildings, fencing, crates, and furniture; wood ash for fertilizer and making soap; sawdust to store ice; nuts and berries as food for people and animals; maples for syrup and sugar; and a shady place to rest from work in open fields. The farmer needed to identify trees and how they could be used. Come see how farms and forests go together! *Instructor: Dr. Walter Shortle, Retired Research Scientist, U.S. Forest Service*
