

Electric Assistance Program

The Electric Assistance Program, or EAP, can help income eligible customers pay their electric bills.

The EAP provides eligible customers with a discount on their monthly electric bills. The discounts range from **8% to 76%**, depending on the customer's gross household income and household size.

All electric utility customers support the statewide EAP through the system benefits charge portion of their electric bill. The EAP discount helps make bills more affordable and helps customers avoid the risk of having their electric service shut off for non-payment. To be eligible for the program, customers must receive an electric bill from a regulated electric utility (Eversource, Unitil, Liberty or NHEC) and have a gross household income that qualifies at the time of application. The EAP is a 12 month bill assistance program. Benefits are subject to the availability of funds. To learn more about the EAP, including how to apply, call your local [Community Action Agency](#) office or view the [EAP brochure](#).

Milton School District Community Listening Sessions

The purpose of the Community Listening Session is to open the lines of communication and facilitate a successful transition for the Milton School District's new Superintendent, Adam Houghton, in key areas: developing relationships with all stakeholders, accelerating the Superintendent's understanding of the Milton School District, and to build on successes while initiating meaningful change.

At each Community Listening Session, participants will work in small groups to brainstorm ideas on three questions:

- * What works well in the Milton School District, and needs to continue?
- * Where do you see areas for growth within the Milton School District?
- * What are your expectations for Milton's new Superintendent of Schools?

The small groups will then identify their top priorities for each question and share them during whole group discussion. Every participant will then vote on their choice of focus for each question. The evening will conclude with a question-and-answer session where participants can ask their questions of the Superintendent.



Milton Conservation Commission Stewardship Walk 8:30-11 am on Saturday, Sept 10 Join us for a stewardship walk around Jones Brook Park, a Milton town-owned conservation parcel off White Mountain Highway near the Village of Union. Our goal is to walk the boundaries of this scenic 20- acre property, so we'll bushwhack along the Jones Brook and Branch River along opposite borders and scout for old flagging and town markers in between. If time allows, we'll also assess new trail possibilities. Twelve participants max. Poison ivy likely in some areas.
