Milton Earth Day Cleanup set for April 26

Do you remember how great the town looked last year after the Earth Day cleanup? Are you ready to make it happen again? Join your neighbors in Milton on Saturday, April 26 to pick up road litter, beautify the town and build community pride in celebration of Earth Day. Cleanup is planned along the White Mountain Highway and Applebee

Road from the Farm Museum to Milton Mills. Both roads are designated NH Hampshire Scenic and Cultural Byways and part of the Branch River Valley Trail.

Gather at the NH Farm Museum, 1305 White Mountain Highway (Rte 125), between 9:30 and 9:45 am for supplies and instructions.

Celebrate afterwards with a potluck lunch starting around noon at the Farm Museum.

Please wear brightly colored clothing for good visibility while walking the roadsides and bring work gloves for picking up trash. Event organizers will assist with planning and safety considerations and will provide bags, road safety cones, and pickup service for separated

Welcome SPRING!

Now, as I type this article, we are expecting snow tonight but according to the calendar, Spring has arrived. With spring though, also comes Milton Fire-Rescue's concern for people and animals falling through the ice on Milton Three Ponds. Please be VERY careful if you choose to go out on the ice. Firefighters never consider any ice to be safe and this time of year proves especially dangerous with the warming temperatures and the beauty of the frozen pond. If you see someone or someone's pet go through the ice, immediately call 911 and start the emergency response as quickly as possible. Milton Fire-Rescue trains for these responses and we have the equipment to do so safely.

One piece of equipment used after someone has been rescued from the chilly waters is a cardiac monitor. Milton has high tech monitors in the ambulances but the Town of Milton also has simpler and very effective "AED's" throughout the town. AED's are Automatic External Defibrillators. These AED's will help not only in a water related cardiac arrest; they assist with any cardiac arrest.

Milton has eleven AEDs in the town located in various places. If you ever find yourself with someone who is laying unresponsive, call 911 and the 911 operator should be able to talk you through performing CPR and be able to dispatch the location of an AED. The AEDs in Milton are registered with the State of New Hampshire. In Milton, AEDs are located at: both the lower and upper floors of the Emma Ramsey Center, the Milton Recreation Beach's Gate House, Milton Mills Free Public Library, Nute High/Middle School (by the main office), Milton Elementary School (by the nurse's office), Mi-Te-Jo Campground, Index Packaging, Short Ridge Academy and there are two more with the Milton Police Cruisers. These AEDs are ready, available and are very easy to use. No one should hesitate to use an AED if the need arises. There is an "on" button and then verbal commands to help you use the machine. If someone does know how to preform CPR, that is a wonderful asset to increase the chances of a positive outcome. Over the last few years, CPR classes have been offered at various times to help community members learn basic CPR skills. If you would like to learn how to perform CPR, Milton Fire-Rescue has two instructors who are willing to teach a course which typically runs three hours. It is called the AHA Friends and Family CPR. A class will be coordinated near the end of April. Please call Milton Fire-Rescue at 603-652-4201 to add your name to the class list.





Angelo's condition is very serious and can be treated but takes extreme caution since Angelo had no symptoms of anything being wrong and nobody ever knew of his critical health condition.

He was born with this malformation and as he grew up the malformation also grew. The day he went to school he had a headache for only 10 minutes before he started loosing his senses.

Before we all knew, he was rushed to Frisbie Memorial Hospital. When he arrived the staff knew Angelo's condition was too serious for the care they could provide him so he was flown to Maine Medical Center in Portland Maine. Within the hour, we found out that he had a seizure at school. Thanks to the fast actions of the Milton EMTs and Frisbie Paramedics my brother received immediate attention.

Although a lot did go wrong a lot of things went right and thankfully we had good weather the day of the incident. Angelo got the care he needed by the amazing people at Maine Medical Center. He has been in a medically induced coma for several weeks now to reduce the swelling in his head and is finally waking up.

Unfortunately, he is not himself yet. My brother is a loving young man and has given so much of himself to help others. He is a tutor for younger children to help them with math and helps the Special Education students at Nute High School with athletics. Anyone that knows

Angelo knows how truly amazing he is. This is a very hard time for him and the family we ask that you keep Angelo in your thoughts and prayers.
