Celebratory Snowshoe Outing Saturday 14, 2012 10:00 am - 1:00 pm To the Jones Brook Hatchery, Milton

Charlie Bridges and Rich Cook of the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department will lead a snowshoe outing from Piggott Hill to the Jones Brook Fish Hatchery in Milton on Saturday January 14 from 10 am to 1 pm. The event is held in celebration of the completion of a conservation easement on 358 acres of land along Jones Brook. This 2.5 mile round trip snowshoe will include a partial bushwhack through mixed forest. Participants are encouraged to bring lunch to enjoy at the scenic hatchery site, where trip leaders will discuss the history of the hatchery and the importance of land conservation for preservation of water resources.

The easement was donated by Branch Hill Farm/the Carl Siemon Family Charitable Trust to the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department in 2008 as part of the Salmon Falls Headwaters Project, which led to the protection of nearly 800 acres valued at \$1.3 million.

Tony Mincu December Town Administrator's Report

Well, still waiting on winter, but we will take what we can get.

The budget season is coming to a close. 2011 ended with a decent surplus. Operational efficiencies, personnel transitions, great budgetary oversight by department heads, effective use of revolving funds, and money saving moves in changing service providers, all have contributed to maintaining a decent balance sheet for the year 2011. The fact that we have not needed a TANS this year speaks volumes.

The proposed 2012 Budget reflects an 8,000 dollar increase, less than 1% from the prior year. Given certain fixed uncontrolled costs such as NH Retirement downshifting from the State, increase in medical costs, which together represent a 50,000 dollar increase from the prior year, one can see that some significant savings and cutting was done in order to keep the overall budget increase at less than 1%. A more detailed and exhaustive explanation of the Budget will come out in the Voters Guide. But as to Warrant Articles, beyond the 'normal' requests, The Fire Dept will be requesting a purchase of a new fire truck, The Highway Dept will be requesting a new 6 wheel dump, and the Town will be requesting monies to implement a step plan for all Town employees (Basically a 14 year blueprint classifying all employees within a paygrade and outlining future pay increases based on satisfactory reviews. Again, the Voters Guide will be fleshing out this information.

EReg, electronic (online) registration for vehicles and dog tags, will be coming. Implementation is on the books for mid-February and we are presently in the process of lining up the providers and the software necessary for rollout. Access to a computer will allow one to complete auto registration renewals online 24/7.

The new year also saw some fundamental changes in Town Hall operations behind the scenes. Payroll has switched to a new provider ADP at a savings of some 50%. The Town's Banking is in the process of moving from TD Bank, which promised us additional service charges and little to no interest, to Federal Savings, which has waived all service fees and is giving our accounts a respectable interest rate. Bookkeeping has been streamlined and operational changes have been instituted in accordance with recommendations from our Auditors.

PSNH has just awarded us a grant for Economic Development. We will be using that money towards the implementation of a development plan with associated materials such as Charette outlining the advantages of Milton for certain business types.

All in all, we are not sitting still. Always looking to increase our efficiencies and looking for opportunities to leverage your Tax dollars to maximum usefulness.

Stay warm this unusual winter and be sure to get out and vote, whether it be for the Primaries or for the Town Deliberative Sessions.

Milton Fire-Rescue is ushering out 2011 with what may be considered as a relatively uneventful year. Although at the time of this writing (the morning of December 28), the call volume of 2011 sits at: 405 fire calls and 460 EMS calls, which is up from the previous 5-year average (865 calls verses 849). In 2011, we did experience Hurricane Irene but by comparison to the northern portion of NH, the Town of Milton got away easy during the one day event. Milton has been able to recover the costs of responding during the storm from FEMA. That being said, there were no serious, catastrophic multi-day events like the 100-year floods of 2006 & 2007, nor the ice storm of 2008. Therefore we bid farewell to 2011 and set our sights on preparing for 2012.

Due to arrive in the Town of Milton for the New Year is a new ambulance. You will quickly notice it as it has been painted red with a black stripe and the EMS Star Of Life. The purchase of this ambulance was made possible with the preplanning of Milton residents several years ago as they created the Ambulance Revolving Account. This account holds money collected from insurance companies for medical transports and has been set aside for the purpose to purchase a replacement ambulance at NO COST to the taxpayer.

With the purchase of the new ambulance, the 1994 Ford truck formerly known as A2, has been traded, the former A1 will become the new secondary ambulance (A2) and will continue to reside at Central station to be used as a back up in the event of maintenance on the new A1 or a simultaneous medical call where A1 is already occupied on a call. If you would like a personal tour of the new ambulance, feel free to contact the station and we will try to schedule a time convenient for you.

As the March budget season approaches, Milton Fire-Rescue will have a warrant article for the purchase of a new fire truck. This truck will carry 1000 gallons of water and will be the replacement of the current 1989 Engine 2 which is housed in Milton Mills' Station 2. Engine 2 is facing multiple issues with maintenance and the need to be re-furbished to become NFPA compliant to enclose the firefighter compartment. A \$50,000 grant has been applied for and another \$50,000 is available in the capital reserve account. The remaining balance to purchase a new engine will be \$250,000 which is proposed to be funded with a 7-year bond of less than \$50,000 per year. You may receive more information on the proposed purchase of this truck by either contacting the Milton Fire Chief at Central Station. Please set February 11th aside to attend the Milton Deliberative Session where you may receive more information on this and other budget items.

Meanwhile as you prepare for 2012, please remember to use fire safety tips like check your chimneys for any buildup of creosote, keep all combustibles at least three feet from a heat source and test your smoke detectors monthly. From a medical point of view, you know your body better than anyone else and if you feel chest discomfort or shortness of breath, please do not hesitate to call 911. Immediate medical interventions may save yours or a loved one's life.



Each Penguin Cake entry must be created on a base no larger then 3ft by 2 ft. long. Smaller is fine. Please make base suitable for size of the cake. There is a 6 inch maximum border allowance around the Penguin Cake. Each cake must be made entirely of edible products with the exception of the base. No artificial display lighting should be used in the construction of the entry.

Who Can Enter

The completion is open to everyone who wishes to participate with a complete entry form. The entries will be judged in three categories (1)Best Children's Entry (12 & under must be done entirely by the child) (2)Best Family Entry (3)Best Organizational Entry. Each cake can only be registered in one category.

How they will be judged

The criteria for judging will include 1.) Structural design (how well does your display stay together) 2.) Creative use of materials 3.) Detailing (how detailed is the overall entry) 4.) Overall excellence.

• Who will Judge

The entries will be judged by members of the Milton Winter Carnival Committee and the Recreation Director. All decisions of the group are final. Judging will take place at the Emma Ramsey Community Center @ 3:00 pm on Saturday, January 11th.
