Natural History of a Local Forest

Moose Mountains Regional Greenways, Branch Hill Farm, and the NH Farm Museum are teaming up to offer a Forestry Workshop on Saturday morning, June 7 starting from the NH Farm Museum in Milton. Licensed NH forester Charles Moreno will lead a field trip to the nearby managed forest of Branch Hill Farm and give an introduction to its natural history. Information will be provided by the Natural Resources Conservation Service about financial grant programs for NH landowners to assist in the implementation of selected management practices.

Moreno has a B.S. in Forestry from UNH and has practiced as a consulting forester for more than thirty years, managing over 30,000 acres of forests for private landowners, conservation organizations, and communities in southern New Hampshire and Maine, including the forests of Branch Hill Farm. After more than 25 years of continuous work on some properties, he remarks, "You can really see the change for the better—a scenic forest stocked with large valuable trees, young growth, and excellent habitat."

Moreno will show participants how to read signs in the woods indicative of the natural history of this and similar New England forests. He will also comment on the forestry management practices used to improve the wildlife habitat and economic value of the Branch Hill Farm working forest.

The workshop will run from 9 am until approximately noon, with a guided walk of a little under two miles through oak, pine and mixed hardwood forests. Return shuttles to the Farm Museum will be provided.


