




Moose Mountains Regional Greenways and the Wolfeboro Public Library

Tony Mincu March Town Administrator's Report

Well, I will keep this one short. The Voters Guide will be out next week and that would contain a lot of the information that I may have included here. Likewise, copies of the Town Report will be available March θ^{th} .

The breaking news is this; we have been approved for multiple grants from the US Rural Development. One is a partial reimbursement towards the purchase of the ambulance. So that money will be returned to the Revolving Fund. Another grant has been approved towards the cost of the proposed purchase of the Fire Truck. Unfortunately until officially announced I cannot discuss numbers, but the amount approved would almost eliminate one year's worth of payments under the lease option. I believe the issue comes down to this; the purchase of a fire truck (now) at a favorable cost and favorable rate versus the guaranteed increased costs and possibilities of unfavorable rates ten years from now; plus, does the Town feel comfortable enough maintaining and counting on a truck 20 plus years old (and counting).

E Reg is being held up by the State approval process. We are ready to go and in fact, the buttons are now present on the website (although not active). We are now on schedule for implementation on April 1. That should be a full roll out—meaning Vitals, Dogs, and Motor Vehicle registrations. In the future we anticipate including property taxes, beach passes and dump stickers.

A note about the content of the Town Report; we have been advised thru the Tax Collectors
Association and legal counsel to not include the listing of delinquent taxpayers in the published report. Apparently, there are only 4 or 5 towns that still continue that practice here in NH. So rather than being set up as a test case for litigation, the BOS has agreed to remove those pages from the Town Report. The list of delinquent taxpayers is still available, upon request, through the Tax Collector's office.

We have transitioned most of the Town's accounts to Federal Savings and the first thing we noticed was a much healthier rate of return on our monies. While we left a national provider (TD Bank), I believe the move to a local and more responsive bank will serve the Town well.

That's it for now, think Spring and be sure to get out and vote on March 13.

Milton Fire-Rescue March Report

Milton Fire-Rescue is exploring the possibility of having the Town of Milton become a "Heart Safe Community" as defined by the NH Department of Safety. As part of this program, Milton Fire-Rescue is wondering if members of the community would be interested in learning how to perform CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation). If this is something that interests you please contact Milton Fire - Rescue at: 652-4201 or miltonfd@metrocast.net or go to the webpage: www.miltonfirerescue.com and find us by clicking on the Facebook link (bottom left corner of the page).

CPR does save lives. The most effective way to help someone in cardiac arrest is to have early interventions and CPR plays a critical role as one of the steps to reviving someone's heart. You will never know when you may need the skills to perform CPR to a loved one or stranger. If this is something that appeals to you, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Education is an ongoing process not only for members of the community but also for the members of Milton Fire-Rescue. Recently several of members have been participating in classes to expand their training of the Incident Command curriculum. These classes are brought to us by the NH Department of Safety. These classes are required for the Town of Milton to qualify for federal funding and also help to prepare us for both local and mutual aid emergency events. More members will be attending classes this year as the program develops with further education.

Finally, as the March budget season approaches, Milton Fire-Rescue will have a warrant article for the purchase of a new fire truck. This truck will carry 1000 gallons of water and will be the replacement of the current 1989 Engine 2 which is housed in Milton Mills' Station 2. Engine 2 is facing multiple issues with maintenance and the need to be re-furbished to become NFPA compliant to enclose the firefighter compartment.

A \$50,000 grant has been applied for and another \$50,000 is available in the capital reserve account. The remaining balance to purchase a new engine will be \$250,000 which is proposed to be funded with a 7-year bond of less than \$50,000 per year. You may receive more information on the proposed purchase of this truck by contacting the Milton Fire Chief at Central Station. Please support the fire department as we try to protect you and your property.
