Meet Milton Firefighters and Get Your Fire Station Questions Answered

The Milton Fire and Rescue Department invites the public to an evening at the Fire Station on Thursday, March 7, from 6:30 to 8:30 pm. Fire Chief Nick Marique will present an informational slide show about the proposed new Milton Fire Station, answer audience questions, and lead a tour of the facility. An informal social hour will feature complimentary refreshments and an opportunity to meet some of the Department's on call firefighters.

Numerous long-standing difficulties with the current fire station are the motivation for a proposed new \$2.7 million facility for the Town of Milton. A committee comprised of the Fire Chief, several town residents, Selectman Bob Bridges, and a paid consultant worked for several months with Eckman Construction and Goudreau Architects to come up with a building that they believe meets the needs of the town in as economical a design as possible. Milton residents will vote on a bond to fund construction of the new station in the March 12 election.

According to the Fire Chief, the existing Milton Fire Station 1, located at 460 White Mountain Highway, is beset by problems that affect the ability of the Fire Department to respond to emergencies. The tour on March 7 will give participants a chance to observe for themselves the undersized garage and vehicle access difficulties, inadequate storage space for gear and supplies, and other issues with apparatus storage.

Marique will also present details of the design and cost of the proposed new station and remind the audience of the many services provided by the mostly volunteer Milton Fire and Rescue department.

Rescheduled: MMRG's Union Meadows Conservation Outing

On Saturday, March 23, Moose Mountains Regional Greenways (MMRG) will hold a guided winter outing on the 120-acre Union Meadows property in Wakefield. The walk starts along a high gravel esker with scenic views into the Branch River gorge below. After about a mile of woods roads, the trip destination offers attractive vistas of the undeveloped shoreline of Union Meadows.

Trip leader MMRG Director of Conservation Keith Fletcher will be joined by Wakefield town officials Dave Mankus and Peter Kasprzyk, Rich Cook of the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department and Mike Speltz from the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests. During the walk, our guides will discuss the important conservation values of the property, identify interesting geological and natural features and signs of wildlife, point out forestry practices implemented on the site, and inform participants about how the land conservation process works. They will also provide an update on the efforts underway to permanently conserve the property.

An underlying theme will be the importance of land conservation for preservation of water resources. In a recent study by the US Forest Service, the Piscataqua/Salmon Falls watershed was found to be the most at risk of degradation of any watershed within the 48 contiguous states due to the potential loss of forested land to residential development. Since the Branch River flows into the Salmon Falls River, the protection of woodlands along its banks and on the Union Meadows shoreline plays a crucial role in maintaining the water quality of the Salmon Falls River downstream.

This free outing will start at 10 am and finish by 1 pm; please bring a lunch or snack. No pets, please. Pre-registration is required; call MMRG Education Coordinator Kari Lygren at 603-978-7125 or email info@mmrg.info.

The event is sponsored by Moose Mountains Regional Greenways in collaboration with the Town of Wakefield, NH Fish and Game and the Forest Society. MMRG, a non-profit land conservation organization, works to conserve and connect important water resources, farm and forest lands, wildlife habitats, and recreational land in Brookfield, Farmington, Middleton, Milton, New Durham, Wakefield, and Wolfeboro. Throughout the year, MMRG offers many educational opportunities to inform all ages about the benefits of our region's natural resources. 
PTA NEWS
