



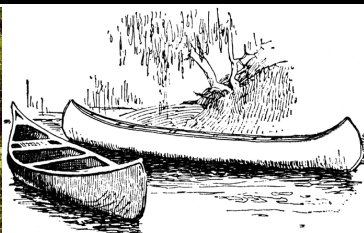

8th Annual Branch River Paddle on May 26, 2012

For the 8th successive year, Moose Mountains Regional Greenways (MMRG) and Branch Hill Farm/Carl Siemon Family Charitable Trust (CSFCT) will offer canoe and kayak enthusiasts the opportunity to enjoy a group paddle of the pristine Branch River in Milton Mills, NH. The event will take place on Saturday, May 26 and features a 4-1/2 mile trip down the Branch River to its confluence with the Salmon Falls River and the upper end of the Milton 3 Ponds. A picnic lunch will be provided at the paddle destination on Branch Hill Farm property. Paddlers should bring their own kayaks or canoes and wear US Coast Guard approved personal flotation devices; transportation for participants and their boats will be provided back to the parking/boat put-in site. Report

A Tale of 2 Safes

Well, Spring has sprung and I have to relate to you the saga of the safes. Besides the local coverage, the Associated Press also picked it up and sightings of the article ranged from Illinois to Florida.

The Town has 3 safes presently residing at the Town House; an early 1800's, and two additional, one probably early 1900's, another mid-20th century. The contents of the 1800 and the mid-20th were unknown at the time. The early 1900's was opened in the past with the door hinges basically being cut off. So here are the results: the 1800 safe was empty, originally it was thought that we would have to safecrack it, but come to find out, the door was stuck and a little bit of muscle power and voila, it opened. The last safe, again a 1950's vintage did require a safecracker and after a couple of hours of drilling and fussing, it was opened. Quite the treasure trove of historical information with a wide range of dates, going back to late 1800's and finishing off in the 1960's. We pulled 2 documents which we will have framed and available for viewing at Town Hall. One was a budget sheet from 1959 which gives one a whole different perspective of costs. Let's just say this, the proposed Town Budget for 1959 was 197,118 dollars; Motor Vehicle permits on the revenue side amounted to 5,605 dollars (Present day numbers are in the 550,000 dollar range.) The second letter comes from the Boston Post's Editor in Chief, (September, 1955) in reference to the Boston Post Cane. It was in response to some sort of inquiry the nature of which we do not know. However, it was interesting reading in that it states the date of origin of the Cane (1906) and that it was to be given to the oldest *male* citizen in that Town. The letter goes on to say that after women got the right to vote the rule was changed to awarding the cane to the oldest surviving *citizen*. Overall, the safes provided a neat history lesson, most of which could not be duplicated.

After that, the report is mostly of mundane matters. The early spring cooperated with the Town and we were able to get a jump on spring clean-up as far as the Highway Department is concerned. The PD has 2 new hires in the pipeline. The Fire Dept is about to receive the new Forestry Truck, and we are in the processing of requesting proposals for the new Pumper. **EREG is up and running**. Presently we have a minimum amount of traffic on that site but people need to become aware of it and start using it. It's quite the time saver and convenient, its available 24/7; no more standing in line or making a special trip down to Town Hall. For those folks who come on Fridays after 100PM, don't despair—use **EREG**. It is available and accessed right on the main page on the Town's website.

Talk about mundane, the auditors are here for the Town's annual financial tune-up. It appears to have gone smoothly, a lot of the financial & operational changes that we have made appear to be working well. We still have a couple more tweaks to put into effect but progress is being made.

Finally, I just want to mention to be on the outlook for quite the summer kickoff. An antique car show, boat races on the lake, we are gearing up for a pretty good sized affair with a lot to do. Check and the Parks and Rec for details and mark your calendars. Till the next newsletter,,,,,

Milton Fire-Rescue May Report

Milton Fire-Rescue will be offering CPR classes to the public starting in May. In an effort to qualify as a NH Heart Safe Community, Milton has held courses for town employees and is now going to offer on May 14th and 31st a Friends and Family CPR class. If you are interested please contact Milton Fire-Rescue and leave a message with your name, telephone number and which day you prefer. These classes are limited in size and will be filled on a first come first serve basis. If neither of these dates work for you but you are still interested, more classes will be offered during the summer months.

Milton Fire-Rescue fought a tough battle of an almost seven acre wildland fire on top of Teneriffe Mountain the end of April. Please be extremely careful and notify emergency dispatch by calling 911 as soon as you detect abnormal smoke or flames. Early interventions may save property or even a life. Members of Milton Fire-Rescue thank you for your cooperation as we try to protect our town and its citizens.

As spring approaches, anyone wishing to burn outside in any form must stop by the fire department and apply for a fire permit. Fire permits will only be issued to Milton landowners or to persons with written landowner permission to burn on any property. Permits will be issued, but residents will only be allowed to burn on days that the fire danger levels will allow. There is someone on duty at the Milton Fire Department Monday - Sunday, from 7:00 am - 5:00 pm. If you stop by and the building is closed, there is a good chance that fire personnel are on a call, so please stop back by at another time. Currently fire permits are free to our residents.

All burning permits are issued with specific guidelines allowing you to burn, along with a list of materials that are permitted to be burned.

When burning, all New Hampshire State Fire Laws must be followed at all times. Residents who do not obtain a valid fire permit can be fined up to \$2,000.00 per violation.

With the dry weather conditions that our area has been experiencing it is more important than ever to adhere to the rules and regulations of the state and to take every precaution you can when burning in your yard for your safety and the safety of your family and property.

The North Bus is a transportation service for the residents of New Durham, Middleton, Milton, Wakefield and Brookfield. The once-a-week service provides access to pharmacies and supermarkets in the Rochester area. The elderly and disabled are given priority.

Riders are picked up at their homes by a friendly volunteer driver in a COAST minibus. The minibus is equipped with a wheelchair lift and can take up to two individuals who are in wheelchairs. It is expected that 10-12 ambulatory persons will be able to ride the bus. No pets are allowed, but service animals are permitted.

Each rider is allowed up to two shopping bags and the bags must be able to be safely stowed under the seat or beside the wheelchair.

The North Bus brings riders to grocery stores, pharmacies, shopping, and services in Rochester. We are only able to visit those destinations that allow for safe access and parking for the minibus. Currently, we bring riders to the following locations:
