More than one in three households being helped by local food banks and pantries includes children. ## Milton Fire and Rescue



### **November Report**

Fall is here! The leaves have turned and plenty have fallen. There is a chill in the air and with this season, Milton Fire-Rescue is reminded that the heating season has begun and a concern of carbon monoxide poisoning. Recently the "School Care Program" published an article on carbon monoxide and it can be summed up as follows.

Carbon monoxide is undetectable to a person without a gas meter. It is colorless and odorless. It is a gas that builds up in enclosed areas where fuels such as wood, gas, oil and pellets are burned without proper ventilation. It is dangerous to life because it replaces the oxygen in your blood stream. The signs of CO poisoning are headaches, dizziness, nausea, fatigue, loss of consciousness and death. Often people in the beginning stages of carbon monoxide poisoning, think they are coming down with the flu. This is not unexpected as the flu is common at this time of year. The difference is easily detected though by installing a carbon monoxide detector.

Certainly the best way to prevent a carbon monoxide problem is to have your heating appliances serviced annually. In addition, install a carbon monoxide detector on each level of your home. If you already have carbon monoxide detectors, test them. If they have batteries, change the batteries like you would for your smoke detectors when you change your clocks this month.

Unlike smoke which rises to the ceiling, carbon monoxide is heavier than air and will sink. If your carbon monoxide detector is not a combination of smoke and CO, your simple carbon monoxide detector should be installed closer to the floor than the ceiling. If your detector is activated, beeping or sounding in any way; please call the fire department. Milton Fire-Rescue owns a gas meter which will identify the level of CO in your home or business. This service is provided at no cost and may save your life or your pet's. If carbon monoxide is detected, Milton Fire-Rescue will help ventilate the building and recheck the gas level.

The piece of mind of knowing that the invisible odorless killer is not in your home, will help everyone sleep better at night.

November has also brought us to the season for being thankful. Milton Fire-Rescue is thankful to the community of Milton who has helped us replenish the shelves of the food pantry in town. The Milton Public Safety Association kicked off a food drive during fire prevention week. In addition, by setting a sign outside Central Station, several community minded citizens have contributed countless food supplies to join us in feeding the Milton residents who utilize the pantry. Our appreciation goes out to each and every person who has helped us, help our community. Thank-you!

### Milton Police Department - Officer Retention Pay

For over 25 years, the MPD had a pay scale near the bottom of the list of all NH Police Departments. Milton is known as the training grounds for all departments as we would pay for the officer to become certified, train them, and they would leave for another department paying two or three times what MPD paid.

Milton's answer to this problem was to keep the pay at the same low level but make the officers sign a contract forcing them to stay in Milton or pay back a pro-rated amount if they leave. The contract is a total of \$21,000.00 for 36 months. This contract is reduced by \$583.33 per month of employment. The problem with this approach is that the other towns are paying such a higher rate that it is still worth the officer to leave and pay the penalty. In some cases, the other town is willing to pay off the contract to get a certified officer.

We as a town should increase the contract to \$32,000.00 for 36 months to cover the total amount of the officer's training cost, reduce the cost by \$888.88 per month of employment. It cost the Town of Milton approximately \$32,000.00 to hire, train, and outfit each officer. We are unable to hire already certified and trained officers due to the low salary we offer.

Over the past ten years, Milton has hired 12 officers. This equals \$384,000.00 of taxpayer money wasted. For additional information on this article, please visit the Town of Milton Website at:
