Town of Milton Capital Improvement Plan Proposal

Many of you may have heard discussion around town about a Capital Improvements Plan (CIP) being created for the Town of Milton. The department heads would like to take the opportunity now and over the next several months to begin the discussion with residents on what a CIP is, what it means to Milton, and how we plan to proceed with the idea.

What is a Capital Improvements Plan?

A CIP is a road map for the town future large expenditures. "Capital" projects are considered those that have a large expense and a useful life of several years. For example, vehicle purchases, road improvements, bridge improvements, technological improvements, building improvements or construction in addition to many other items.

What does this mean to Milton?

The intent is that a successful CIP will help establish a stable tax base all while accomplishing projects. The town of Milton has had many projects over the past several years that have been competing with each other for voter approval. In 2015 the department heads will be proposing a few key warrant articles for approval. Each warrant article in 2015 will represent a physical project for example, the highway trucks and highway grader will be replaced, a playground will be installed at the beach, the library repairs will be continued and the fire station plans will be completed.

What does Milton need to do to create a CIP?

For Milton to create a successful CIP a warrant article must be approved in March of 2015 authorizing the creation of a CIP in accordance with New Hampshire RSA 674:5. The March vote will not only authorize the creation of a CIP it will authorize a specific board or committee to oversee the CIP. The committee/board will then create the CIP and present it to the voters in March of 2016 for the plans annual funding appropriation.

Residents are invited to join us on Wednesday, October 29th at 6:00 pm for a complimentary dinner and dessert. Following the meal there will be a presentation by the town's department heads on the future capital needs of Milton. The conclusion of the evening be an open community conversation that will focus on how we can all work together to continue to meet the needs of our residents while improving and growing our community. Please join us and share your thoughts and ideas about Milton's Future.

Milton Fire and Rescue



October Report

Milton Fire-Rescue is ready for fall, the apple picking, pumpkin carving and Fire Prevention Week! October 6 through the 11th is the week recognized around the United States as a time to remember to be Fire Safe! For several years, maybe decades, Milton Fire-Rescue members have enjoyed going into the Milton Elementary School to teach fire prevention to the younger grades. This year we will be doing a similar program teaching students to "Stop, Drop and Roll" if their clothes catch on fire; we remind them to test their smoke detectors and to practice fire drills even at home. Although we go into the school to work with younger students, these lessons are good for every one of every age.

October will also bring the beginning of the "holiday season". Halloween kicks off a season of holidays with costumes and candy. Milton Fire-Rescue members enjoy a good time and for the second year in a row, will be hosting the Milton Fire-Rescue Open House for ALL ages. Costumes are encouraged. Prizes and refreshments will be on hand. This will be held on the night of Trick-or-Treat. So while you plan your Trick-or-Treat route, be sure to include a stop at Central Station on White Mountain Highway.

Milton Fire Station Updates



As you most of you are aware the proposed fire station was once again defeated in March of 2014. So where do we go from here? A lot of time was spent between late winter and a mid-summer trying to answer that question. We came up with the following solution:

The fire station will be presented for approval in two parts over a two year period. The first year funds will be requested to finalize the schematic design and prepare bid documents. To accomplish this a warrant article will be presented in March of 2015 in the amount of \$143,000. If approved the design will be completed and the project will be bid around December of 2015. The complete cost of the construction will then be presented on a warrant article in March of 2016. With this new approach the expected date of completion would be early 2017.

In addition to breaking the project up into a multi-year proposal other changes have occurred. The fire station has been reduced in size by 25% going from 12,000 sq/ft to 9,000 sq/ft.

In order to redesign the station and not expend additional funds the contracts with Goudreau Architects and Eckman Construction were extended to cover the next two year period. As a reminder approximately \$30,000 was approved and expended to create the previous schematic design and estimate. In addition to reducing the square footage the station will be presented as a more traditional design with opposing peaked roofs rather than the previous flat and peaked roof combination. Much time and energy was invested in reviewing the plans to determine what could be reduced or removed without effecting the operational efficiency and the needs of the department. The following changes have been implemented:

The apparatus bays have been reduced from 80' deep to 75' deep.

The space between each truck has been reduced by 1'.

The size of the training room has been reduced.

The kitchen has been reduced to meet the minimal needs of the on duty firefighters/EMTs.

The day room has been removed.

The Emergency Operations Center has been removed. The training room will now be utilized as the EOC.

The mezzanines for storage have been removed.

The toilet facility on the apparatus bay has been removed.

The additional time prior to construction could allow the fiscal state of the town to improve.

What's the benefit of the new approach? The reduction in square footage should correlate to a reduction in cost. The cost of the design will no longer be included in the final construction cost thus reducing the bond request in 2016. By completing the design and bidding the project the price should be further reduced. The previous proposal was an estimate based on a schematic design. Z

An estimated cost of the redesigned fire station will be available later this fall, once available the new number will be provided to the residents. 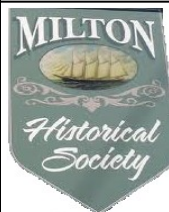

This program is possible through a partnership with Community Action Partnership of Strafford County and begins Monday, September 22. Community Action staff will be on site at Goodwin Community Health, 311 High Street in Somersworth, to meet with applicants and take applications.

This service will be available every Monday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. through November 24. "Collaborations with community partners like Goodwin Community Health are important to making sure we can bring critical services like fuel and electrical assistance directly to the clients," says Betsey Andrews Parker, CAP's Executive Director. "Summer may just be winding down, but we want to make sure everyone who is eligible for assistance has an opportunity to apply before winter is here." The Low Income Home Heating Program provides certified eligible households with assistance in paying their energy bills in winter, and the New Hampshire Electrical Assistance gives eligible customers a discount on their monthly electric bills.
