

Tony Mincu August Town Administrator's Report

The summer is just about gone. Changes here seem perpetual whether in personnel or procedures, but change, although difficult, can be a good thing.

The Town Clerk's Office has posted new hours. They are now open on Fridays till 400 PM. Starting in September, they will also be open on the LAST Saturday of the Month from 8:00-Noon. We also welcome 2 new assistants, Bob Naeger and Judy Gaudet. Bob you probably all know from his time on various commitees and boards. Judy comes to us from having served over the past 7 years in similar posts in other Towns. Despite the complete, 100% turnover in that office, we were only shutdown for one day's of training. Kudo's to Michelle and the various Town Clerk personnel we had from other local towns which helped with the transition and the expertise to get us up and running. But Michelle and company is not stopping there. We are planning on implementing an online look-up of Property Tax information with an additional component that would make online payments of taxes available to the pubic. Stay tuned for details.

Change is coming in the Welfare Department as well. Strafford County CAP has pretty much told us that after some 15 plus years of strategic partnering, they are no longer interested in maintaining the relationship as far as providing a welfare director. This was a 'pay for service' arrangement, some 18000 dollars yearly, so we are presently exploring this opportunity to perhaps streamline that process, bring our costs down, and get some more control of the yearly welfare budget. When we first arrived on the scene, welfare accounted for 175,000 dollars of the Town's Budget. In a town of 5000 persons, this is virtually unheard and rivals of some of the large Towns and smaller cities. We have brought the budget down to \$138,000 (still excessive) and hope to get it under 120000 for next year. Again, stay tuned for details as this develops.

We have 2 new police officers graduating in September. We look forward to putting them on the road asap given the staffing shortages that we have in the PD. On a more personal and serious note, Officer Mark Cilley was recently diagnosed with a cancer and is presently undergoing chemotherapy therapy. We are confident that he will come back stronger than ever, but in the meantime we ask that you keep him and his family in your prayers. Also please be aware of various fundraisers and/or events that may be going on to help him with his recovery and medical. One such event is posted on our webpage and around town.

Financially, we are in good financial shape. I do not predict any need for a TANS. I cannot predict as of yet, what the property tax setting rate will look like. That procedure has changed as well due to budget cuts in Concord with pretty much everything being done electronically. We are up to date on our submitted forms for DRA so I anticipate Taxes will go out on time despite the many changes in the Tax Collectors/Town Clerk office.

The Sewer Department has committed to some infrastructure repairs this year. They have been doing some manhole cover repair/replacements and we have also done a reroofing of the plant facility. Since the Town has taken over the billing and collections we have reduced the uncollected amounts leftover from prior commissions from 64,000 to the present day 27,000 dollars. This will also be the first year in which the Plant Operator, Dale Sprague, will be presenting a budget. We look for it to be much more realistic and accurate as to what it takes to operate that facility.

Finally, this brings us to the Town Budget. I predict this will be a very difficult year for holding the line. For the past 2 years we have cut back on personnel and costs and I honestly believe we are at the tipping point between responsible budget management and an overall degradation of services if further cutting is undertaken. Rest assured we will undertake cost saving measures where we can but some difficult decisions lie ahead.

Enjoy the last remnants of summer and the beginning of cooler weather.

Milton Fire and Rescue

Milton Fire-Rescue is anxious to announce the progress of the fire station building committee's diligent work this summer! The committee has been comprised of: a selectman, a budget committee member, a few fire department members and interested residents. The committee has selected Eckman Construction along with Goudreau and Associate Architects to construct the new fire station. The design is well underway and the hope is to have it viewable by the public late this fall. The final proposal will be ready for formal presentations during the winter months followed by the vote at the March election. The property identified for the construction site remains at 855 White Mountain Highway, formally known as the Moose Lodge's Quonset hut. This property was generously donated in 2010 by the Herbert Downs family for the sole purpose to construct a fire station within seven years. The site's "building friendly" status should make for smooth construction.

Please watch for further updates in Milton's Gazette and plan to attend a presentation of the final design of the building this winter. The public presentations will be made known through the use of the Milton Gazette, Milton Fire-Rescue's and the Town of Milton's Facebook and web pages, along with flyers posted in public places around town. If you have an interest and have not seen any current information posted, please do not hesitate to contact the personnel at the fire station for an update. You may call us at: 603-652-4201.

Summer flew by and now we progress on to fall and the New England heating season. Please be careful as you start up those wood and pellet stoves. It is highly recommended to have your chimney's cleaned and inspected prior to the heating season. If you would like suggestions on the stove's installation for your personal property, you may schedule an inspection. Permits are not required to install stoves yet inspections are recommended. The inspection will not prevent you from using the stove but may provide you with some helpful information for safe operation and use of the stove for heating purposes.

Basic solid fuel stove inspection details include but are not limited to measuring the distances to combustibles (recommendation of 36") and inspecting the stove pipe for "no cracks" or weaknesses, etc. Having a fire extinguisher within reach of the stove is also highly recommended. Fire extinguishers come in four (4) different classifications. For a woodstove or for common household purposes, homeowners should have an "ABC" extinguisher. This extinguisher is good for fighting ordinary combustibles (paper and wood products), flammable liquid and electrical fires. Although fire extinguishers are great for putting out small fires, there are times NOT to fight a fire. Someone should not stay and fight a fire when:

- The fire could block your only exit.
- The fire is spreading too quickly.
- The fire is too large.
- The house is filling with smoke.

You are unsure how to use the fire extinguisher or if your instincts simply tell you not to.

Recently Milton Fire-Rescue received a press release from the NH State Fire Marshal's Office concerning household fires. These fires are being caused by 9-volt batteries being improperly stored. Those simple rectangular batteries have both their negative and positive posts located on the same end of the battery. If a metal object (paperclip or even another battery) touch both posts at the same time, heat is produced and can start a fire. The press release was warning homeowners not to store 9-volt batteries loose in kitchen drawers. Batteries should be stored in their original packaging or the ends should be kept covered. If you no longer have the original packaging, placing electrical tape over the posts will help protect the posts from generating heat.

As we close this article, please remember to check your smoke detectors and review emergency exit plans for your family. Find a safe meeting place and practice a fire drill. Careful planning before a fire will be very helpful in the event you need to evacuate in an emergency.

Voter ID Law - Laws of 2012, Chapter 284 Explanatory Document

During the 2012 legislative session the legislature passed Senate Bill 289, also known as the "Voter ID" Law. The new law will phase-in a photo identification requirement over a period of time.

This explanatory document is required under the "Voter ID" law as part of the process of educating the public about the law's requirements and application and outlines the law's requirements for 2012.

What type of photo ID will I need in order to vote?

For any election before Sept. 1, 2013, you will be asked to provide one of the following:

- Driver's license issued by any state (even if expired);
- ID card issued by NH DMV (Division of Motor Vehicles);
- U.S. Armed Services ID card;
- U.S. Passport (even if expired);
- Valid photo ID card issued by either the federal government or a state, county or municipal government;
- Valid student ID card
- Other photo ID deemed legitimate by the supervisors of the checklist, the moderator, or the clerk; or
- Verification of identity by a supervisor of the checklist, the moderator or the clerk.

What if I do not have an approved photo ID?

<u>Before November 1, 2012</u>, any voter who does not present an approved photo ID will be informed of the new law and permitted to vote.

<u>Between November 1, 2012 and September 1, 2013</u>, any voter who does not present an approved photo ID will be permitted to vote after executing a "challenged voter affidavit."

A voter who does not have an approved photo ID may obtain a free photo ID for voting purposes only by presenting a voucher from their town/city clerk or the Secretary of State to any NH DMV office that issues identification.

Is there any post-election action required by me after I vote without an approved photo ID?

<u>After November 1, 2012</u>, if you filled out a "challenged voter affidavit" in order to vote on Election Day, you will receive a verification letter from the Secretary of State, requesting confirmation that you voted in the election. If you do not respond in writing to the Secretary of State within 30 days of the date it was mailed, the Attorney General will conduct an investigation to determine whether fraudulent voting occurred.
