# Town of Milton Board of Selectmen Meeting August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019 Milton Town Hall

#### Meeting call to order

R. Thibeault welcomed all in attendance and stated the board would conduct the first of many nonpublic meetings.

**Motion:** R. Thibeault moved to start nonpublic meeting with non-agenda item #1, 91A: 3 II (c). A. Rawson seconded 3-0

**Motion:** R. Thibeault moved to reopen public meeting to continue in nonpublic item #2, 91-A:3 II(c) E. Hutchings seconded. 3-0

**Motion:** R. Thibeault moved to reopen the public meeting sealing meeting minutes for one year. A. Rawson seconded. 3-0

R. Thibeault welcomed all in attendance reciting the pledge.

Stated the Board excuses Town Administrator Creveling from the meeting.

#### **New Business:**

#### 1. Fire Station Driveway Parking Repairs

N. Marique presented the board with three quotes for resealing and restriping for the fire station driveway and made a suggestion of Armor-Guard Sealcoating due to their quote and the references of the company he previously requested. E. Hutchings questioned why the project was needed for such a new building. N. Marique stated this was normal wear and tear and acts of general maintenance and preventive measures for complete repaving. Stated the sealing would last 3-5 years where it would be upwards of \$50,000 to repave the driveway in 10 years and the monies would be expended from the remaining fire station bond as opposed to the budget or warrant for the full repaving approach.

**Motion:** A. Rawson moved to continue with the project with the use of Armor-Guard Sealcoating for \$6,399. A. Rawson seconded. 2(Thibeault, Rawson)-1(Hutchings). Motion passed by majority.

# 2. Casey Road Restrictions and Parking

K. Golab presented the board with a drafted welcome sign for the Casey Road property explaining what will be permitted (hiking, nature study, cross country skiing, snow shoeing, fishing) and prohibited (motorized vehicles, bicycling, hunting, trapping, target shooting,

camping, horseback riding, all fires) uses requesting the Board of Selectmen's approval on continuing.

**Motion:** E. Hutchings moved to approve the signage request as written. R. Thibeault seconded for discussion.

R. Krauss questioned the specification of bikes, if it was intended for all bikes or just motorized. K. Golab stated it was designed to be for all bikes due to the land damaging factor and safety of patrons walking the trail. R. Thibeault questioned if it were a possibility to enforce comparable restrictions in place for the hiking trails near the Farm Museum. K. Golab stated they were comparable upon her belief. R. Thibeault questioned the possibility of the Conservation Commission agreeing to restricting bike usage for particular dates or seasons of the year or allowing usage of bicycles as a trial basis. K. Golab stated that would be a possibility.

Motion: Roll call vote on presented motion; 0-3. Motion failed.

E. Hutching moved to approve amended sign to exclude bicycling use as a prohibited use all other portions to remain as proposed. R. Thibeault seconded. 3-0

K. Golab stated regarding the parking discussion, there is a proposal to expand the parking and turn around area to allow busses from the school to turn around for day trips. Stated she spoke to Public Works Director, P. Smith, and said the tree work needed to continue the project would be completed this fall.

#### 3. Milton Mills Flag Pole Replacement Request

R. Graham stated the Veterans of Milton have annually replaced the flags at both Veterans park as well as in the center of Milton Mills. Stated the current flag pole in Milton Mills is damaged and in need of replacement due to not being able to repair the damages. Made a request to expend from the Durgin Fund for the replacement of the flag pole once an exact pole was decided on. R. Thibeault requested the project have quotes along with a suggestion of product for the board to then make a final decision but supported the project. R. Graham stated he would research options and report back at the next Board of Selectmen's meeting.

# 4. September Meeting Schedule Adjustment

R. Thibeault stated the first Monday in September falls on a holiday which requires a date adjustment to the following week.
