Pet Waste can contain:

- E.coli
- Salmonella
- Giardia
- Roundworms and Hookworms
- Nitrogen, which with excessive amounts depletes the oxygen for other organisms by causing algae blooms.

All of the bacteria in pet waste can cause serious health problems in humans. If these pathogens enter the watershed, the water will be dangerous for recreational activities.



Stormwater Information

Anytime pet waste is left in your yard, on the side of the road, or on the trails in Town, rain washes it into the stormwater drainage system.

The waste, and its contaminants, make its way to streams, rivers, and then to our lakes.



When a waterbody, has impairments such as E.coli, the water cannot be used for all of the recreational activities the residents of Milton enjoy.
