Article 2: Zoning- Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 1 as proposed by the Planning Board for the existing Town Zoning Ordinance as follows: adding a new Article XXIII, to establish a Gateway Business Overlay District Ordinance that pursuant to RSA 674:21, I(h) and (j) which will provide an environment that encourages efficient and attractive commercial development along southern NH Rte. 125 that is the main gateway to the village? The ordinance facilitates development with high quality designed landscaping, low impact development, and village character building design. Article 3: Zoning- Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 2 as proposed by the Planning Board for the existing Town Zoning Ordinance as follows: To update the Official Zoning Map of the Town of Milton by moving the Commercial-Residential zoning district boundary to the rear property boundary of road frontage lots that are currently located in the Commercial-Residential district instead of the zone boundary located 200-ft. away from and parallel to the road right of way, thereby eliminating split zoned lots? Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be Four Million, Seven Hundred Seventy-Four Thousand, Nine Hundred Fifty-Three Dollars (\$4,774,953) which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town or by law; or the governing body may hold one (1) special meeting, in accordance with NH RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budge only.
